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The report of the meeting of the Mangala Maha Sabha held in connection with the Hon. All the members present were accepted and the business was started in accordance with the law. Accordingly, the report of the Maha Sabha for the past decade was approved. It was seconded by the Hon. M. Ajith Pushwe Nandana. No objection was raised in the meeting in this regard.

MP R.M. Ajith Kumara proposed that it be appropriate, while MP D.M. Ajith Pushave Nanda seconded. The council's approval was given in the face of the objections to the proposal.

10. Minimize the amount of garbage in the area.

The Hon. Chairman stated that the garbage disposal in Siyambalanduwa town and other towns is irregular and that the opinion of the council should be sought for that. He further stated that the institution is not necessarily bound to remove the garbage since the Siyambalanduwa garbage disposal system has not been established yet. The business community has been thinking for decades that the council should remove the garbage. We should change that opinion. We are working hard to implement this. As part of this pilot project, under the Clean Sri Lanka program, the traders from the Oya River to the office building, the Dothul Marg, the Gunola Mudalali market, and all the other vendors should be involved in the Shramadan and the agreement of all the vendors should be made in accordance with the guidelines and it was decided that action would be taken against anyone who violates those guidelines. I can come here directly because of the weather and we will take action to remove the mobile and stationary vendors who are selling in this area. However, the identified and necessary vendors should be provided with facilities. Let us consider the issues related to the issue. Let us take action to improve these areas in the future. Let us also carry out this project as a pilot project and stabilize the city. In this regard, the Hon. R.M. Amaravansa stated that this is a very important step. It was emphasized that it is appropriate to work by involving inter-institutional agencies. In this regard, the Hon. R.M. Inrawathi stated

The city of Dadambagahadawala is facing this problem and steps should be taken to ensure that the garbage is properly segregated and disposed of by raising awareness through public announcements. It is appropriate to extend the garbage collection area to the Liyandagalle junction. The area near the Dadambagahadawala school is in a very poor condition. Let's educate the school children and take steps to beautify the city. The Hon. Speaker has stated that all the garbage collected from outside the city is being brought to Siyambalanduwa city and that the people are not aware of the need to separate and dispose of the garbage. Let us inform all institutions about this situation. Let us discuss these situations through the Steering Committee and make the necessary announcements.

11. Another problem facing the area is the problem of pilgrims.

Although more than 1500 elephants have been planted throughout the division, only about 300 are currently in operation. Elephants are essential due to the damage caused by wild elephants to areas such as Mahakaludagalle. We can learn that elephants have been planted in many unnecessary places in the district. We will look into this and provide them to the most necessary places. We request all the members to pay attention to the issue. This issue does not concern the people. Therefore, we will now work on the issue. The Hon. Speaker, while adding his remarks, said that it is necessary to present proposals from a national perspective and that a large amount of money should be spent on lighting, and that we are not in a better position in that sector. We will identify the inactive bulbs in all 48 districts for the cost incurred and activate them as necessary. As a pilot project, steps will be taken to install LDR bulbs in the city areas at night. For this, the Hon. Speaker proposed to purchase 500 bulbs and 200 LDR bulbs. The motion was seconded by the Hon. M. Ajith Pushawenanda. The House fully agreed to it. The Hon. W. A. Pushawejith Madhusankha Amarasinghe stated that since there is a problem of wild elephants in some areas of the district, it is necessary to provide shelter to those areas and it was proposed that it be identified by the Committee. The motion was seconded by the Hon. R. M. Inrawathi. Similarly, the Hon. R. M. Dahawalatha stated that the areas of Dodu Stadium, Dolisiya and Pusawathakalaya are very crowded.

The Hon. H.M. Madhawaswa Indika Bandara, Member of Parliament, stated that the government warehouse, MOH office, and the Civil Service Office in the district are in complete darkness, and children and the elderly are constantly being harassed.

It is essential to do this. The Honorable Speaker, we have conducted a site survey regarding the Athmadal Stadium. Its condition is very deplorable. They have been reduced to rubble. We will collect all the information and plan a program to implement it.

The meeting was adjourned for 05 minutes. The motion was made by the Hon. Vice Chairman and seconded by Hon. R. M. Amaravans. Upon resuming the meeting, the Hon. Chairman informed the meeting that it was appropriate to obtain 500 bulbs and 200 LCD monitors of the prescribed standards, as the Council does not have sufficient funds and the Council fund does not face any obstacles. It was further announced that the meeting hall owned by the institution will be made available to the public and the approved fees will be charged for that. However, in certain unavoidable circumstances, it is possible for government institutions to obtain this hall, and in such circumstances, the opinion of the House was sought for the restrictions on the conditions under which they are unable to pay the fees. In that regard, the Hon. B.B. Sirith Priyadarshana stated that it was appropriate to allocate funds in special circumstances. Hon. De. R.M. Amaravansa seconded the motion, stating that it was appropriate to empower the House to decide who should be given the funds. Hon. T.W. Mr. Uli Wasantha Kumara proposed that it would be appropriate to charge the cost of running the hall, water and electricity at a rate of ten per cent and that the funds should be provided with the approval of the Hon. Council as soon as possible. The proposal was seconded by Hon. E.A. Pushwejith Madusankha Amarasinghe, who further stated that the government is committed to providing services in the country and that it would be appropriate to provide funds for government institutions that cannot spend the money available, for the needs of the tourism sector, for religious activities and to collect money on all occasions. This idea was reiterated by Hon. M. Vasantha Ranjith Kumara. The Council agreed to this. It was decided that it would be appropriate to proceed with the revision of the tax rates to improve the facilities. The Hon. Council then made some further recommendations. Accordingly, in

accordance with the Pradeshiya Sabha Act No. 15 of 1987, the Hon. Council, the Chief Health Regulatory Authority of the Division, should issue a letter of authorization to the Public Health Inspectors who are engaged in the maintenance of public health and letters of authorization should be issued to the members of the committees established in accordance with the Pradeshiya Sabha Act.

It was announced that appropriate proposals will be provided to the Honorable Members for consideration in preparing the 2026 Budget. The opinion of the House was also sought regarding the regulation of fuel consumption in the vehicles owned by the institution and the process to be followed in this regard. The Honorable De.R.M. Amaravansa stated that he agreed to the above matter. He also stated that the fuel consumption should be reviewed and that any suggestions and proposals received from external parties should be taken into consideration. Accordingly, fuel should be issued to all vehicles on a specific date in the presence of the nominated members or officers. It was stated that the drivers should arrange for the proper handover of the vehicles when they are using them and when they are stopped after driving. The Hon. De. M. Vasantha Ranjith Kumara stated that it is appropriate to take the status report on the current situation of the vehicles, the use of fuel provided to those vehicles and the past performance into consideration. The Council decided that the fuel inspection of the company nominated by the Hon. Chairman was appropriate. The Chairman also stated that all the details should be taken care of so that the officers do not go to the COPE Committee in the future. At this, Hon. T.W. Mr. Uli Wasantha Kumara had asked that there should be regulation on the fuel provided to public health inspectors and dog vaccinators. It was referred to the Research Committee.

• The Hon. H.M. Madhawasawa Indika Bandara requested that the report regarding fuel-provided vehicles be submitted to the Finance Department.

Feelings and emotions.

01. The request made by Mr. Udeni Samaradakoon, No. 300, 5th Village, to set aside a plot of land near Siyambalanduwa Dola for the purpose of planting flowers and distributing them for religious purposes was tabled. The unanimous approval of the council was given. The Hon. R.M. Inrawathi said that the project is a very important project and that such people should be brought together and implemented in the future.

02. The Council agreed to proceed with the request made by H.M. Dhanushawaka Wemu Kumara for the rehabilitation of the 124 Perakumpura Gamagala road under the PSDG program.

03. The Council agreed to submit the request made by Mrs. Y. Sumanawathi for the repair of the Mayuragama road from the Mayuragama junction to the future development proposal.

04. The request made by Mr. D.M. Mudalihami regarding the construction of a drain for the drainage of the land with a playground located in the village of Muthukandadiya 2 was tabled. It was agreed that it would be appropriate to refer the matter to the Technical Committee and process it based on the recommendations received.

05. Mrs. E. Chamila Krishanthi, who was the wife of her husband, had requested 10 Sidamanthi Dakat for assistance from the Mahakaludagalle area. The recommendation of the Grama Niladhari for the land was received and the approval of the Council was given that it was appropriate to provide this Sidamanthi Dakat, after receiving the recommendations of the Hon. Governor.

06. The request for the construction of the road near the Dayaratne Sawatara Church in Nugagahakula was tabled. The proposal was submitted for future development proposals and the approval of the council was given to proceed accordingly.

Proposals duly adjourned -

The Honorable Speaker, who had been summoned for the purpose of carrying out essential duties, handed over the chair to the Honorable Speaker and the House adjourned.

Motion presented by the Hon. W.A. Pushchapajith Madusankha Amarasinghe -

01. Unanimous approval was given to rehabilitate some roads in the Katiyagala area.

02. Arrangement of the lamp - It was decided that it was appropriate to proceed with the decision given after discussing the matter with the committee.

03. The Hon. Speaker asked the Hon. Y. A. P. Madushanka Amarasinghe, MP, to clarify the resumption of the Katiyagala Sati Dola. The Hon. Member stated that the Katiyagala public dola is in season and that it is held during the rainy season. Other public dolas have to bear heavy losses due to heavy rains.

At the same time, the population of the area is growing. Therefore, the Katiyagala Public Water Supply System, which can be easily maintained at a very low cost, needs to be re-established.

I request you to do so. If the institution's response and vehicle facilities for the dam cannot be adequately utilized in this situation, I propose to develop it personally or through mediation in the future, which will be arranged in a formal manner. I request you to provide adequate response for the dam in the upcoming year's budget. For that, I request you to provide a full report from the Housing and Community Development Committee.

The Hon. R.M. Amaravansa, who had been given the deadline to present the proposal to the House, expressed his intention to present his views in a timely manner, as the deadline had passed.

- I. The Katiyagala forest lands have been divided into forest reserves and forests and the people's livelihoods have been removed, causing great injustice to the people living in the area over the years.

I would also like to mention that Siyambalanduwa Kalayam was burnt to a high level and that the Dam Dahawan Dagathana was burnt to ashes. Even if a certain amount of land is banned in the year 2020 it is believed that it is between 60,000 and 90,000 in size. I do not know how this council can provide a permanent solution to this problem. It is worth raising this issue for the lands belonging to our jurisdiction and presenting it to the main institutions of the division. Let us pass this proposal that I am presenting and send it to the Regional Coordination Committee through the Regional Secretariat. After that, it is appropriate to send it to the District Coordination Committee and through them to the Ministry Secretariat. I would like to inform you that the entire purpose of this is to make the people who are suffering feel that all the people are suffering in a special way.

- II. The next proposal is to intervene in the welfare of the staff. The welfare programs are already being implemented by them and their needs are being met. This proposal is appropriate for the management of human resources at a high level and for regulation in order to ensure the efficiency of the staff.

The Honorable Mr. R.M. Avabpala.

The Hon. R.M. Amaravansa has proposed a very thoughtful proposal and I am supporting it. I also respect him for that. I appreciate the fact that the council is working with the right objectives from the various departments. Even though the land issue is a problem, the high-level interventionists are following the right methods and taking decisions to fulfill their needs. I have been working with the people for the past few years for the land. I followed the idea of providing land to the poor. Now this group of people is directly involved in the economic development of the council. The former district councilor took decisions by understanding the land very well. However, all the leaders of the country were united at that time. However, there was no practical solution. I am the one who is most blamed for the sugar problem. A fair solution has not been provided even today. This situation is also a situation that affects the children of the district. I agree with any decision taken by the council for the betterment of the people of the district. Let us stand together and raise our voice for the citizens of the district. The current situation of the Athimal Sugar Company is also very sad. I am the first to complain. It is said in the story that sugar is a commodity. That is why the farmers are paying taxes for sugar. We will intervene to attract the farmers who are paying taxes for sugar. I came to power in 5 years. If the right thing is done, we will give our full support. Accordingly, I will reiterate the two proposals made by the Hon. R.M. Amaravansa and we will give the unanimous consent of all the members of the House.

Hon. L.L. Sujith Kumara, along

with the rest of the community, made the announcement. All the people of the country agree with this proposal. Damanaragala is a very valuable place and the Kumbwekan Oya irrigation scheme can make these cultivated lands very fertile. Therefore, we request that the necessary intervention be made to implement this irrigation project. We will ensure that we get the maximum benefit from it in this difficult situation.

The Honorable Mr. W.M. Wasantha Ranjith Kumara

The land acquired from the Katiyagala landless people is currently being implemented through various means. This decision of the council is also very important for the implementation of those activities. The council was then asked by the council secretary about the legal status of the committee. The council secretary clarified this. When the council resumed its business, the hon. council secretary said that the second proposal of the hon. R.M. Amaravansa would be forwarded to the finance and budget committee and the report would be received and a decision would be taken. The Hon. Member proposed that a letter be sent to the tenants of shop number 01, which is located in front of the Athimadal Dolisiya, belonging to the Pradeshiya Sabha, stating that it is difficult to pay fines for the shops and that the fines cannot be paid. The main reason for this is the dilapidated condition of the shops and the fact that they are kept indoors during rainy days. At this point, Hon. De. R.M. Amaravansa stated that he was aware of all the circumstances surrounding the acquisition of these shops and the temporary leases, and that despite this, they were not able to sell them, and that they were seeking relief by filing complaints or submitting letters of condolence. It was stated that no unnecessary compensation should be given. Hon. T.W. Oli Wasantha Kumara stated that he did not know whether money was kept in these shops. Hon. B.B. Sirith Priyadarshana stated that he had been informed about this situation and that it was appropriate to intervene if they could act in accordance with the instructions of the council and take necessary measures. The tenth is that the land of the people subject to tax is owned by the council. Furthermore, the Hon. Sirith Priyadarshana asked that the vendors pay the proper taxes and that the institutions do not perform maintenance work. No shop should be given interim rent. If the tenant has already paid the rent, he should be informed. If there are any interim rents, it was requested to provide information about it and proceed in the future. Similarly, Hon. L. H. Mrs. Harshani Madhumali stated that the majority of the women who run the shops are women and that they receive Rs. 7500.00 as rent, and accordingly, they are provided with supervision facilities. Hon. R.M. Dahawalatha stated that there are many problems in running the shops. Accordingly, it was decided that it would be appropriate to intervene in some way to collect the tax. Similarly, Hon. L.L. Sujith Kumara stated that the deposits in the shops in those villages are with the financial institution and if so, whether the relevant measures are being taken.

The Hon. M. Wasantha Ranjith asked that the shops levied by the Dadambagahadawala Pradeshiya Sabha have been demolished in the past and it is appropriate to submit a report on this. Accordingly, the Hon. Mr. U. Council stated that it is appropriate to obtain a summary report on the matter. Let us submit it to the Committee on Industrial Affairs to review the current situation. Let us obtain this report from the General Assembly.

The Honorable Speaker reiterated his opinion and informed that the work had been done by the Auditor General in the letter and that it was necessary to obtain equipment for the Assembly Hall.

Its facilities should be improved. The council funds that are decided there should be sufficient money. It is appropriate to give priority to the situation and obtain the necessary information. Thereafter, the Honorable U. Council presented to the Council the letter submitted by the villagers to repair the Malmadadiya Deva Road from near Ritigahawatta Church. It was stated that it would be decided to proceed with the approval of the Council and to proceed to a suitable place. Furthermore, the request made by the villagers to repair the Dagadamulla Galdekatuwa Road was presented to the Honorable U. Council in a letter. With the approval of the Council, the Honorable U. Council stated that it would be presented to the Regional Coordination Committee in the future and necessary further action would be taken.

The proposals submitted by the committees were presented to the House by the Hon.

I hereby submit to the General Assembly the following matters discussed at the Finance and Budget Committee meeting held on 17.06.2025, for the information of the General Assembly, the following issues and ideas that were discussed at the Finance and Budget Committee meeting.

01. Bodies that are necessarily bound to be governed by the Pradeshiya Sabha (Constitutional Bodies)

Such matters are not required to be submitted for committee approval and are submitted directly to the Hon.

It was decided that it was appropriate to take the necessary measures to show mercy to the Lord.

02. The travel expenses of public health workers were approved. (Monthly work completed)

03. It was decided that it would be appropriate to purchase the lamps through a procurement committee established by the committee.

Done.

04. When carrying out work related to the repair of tube wells in the area,

It was decided to take action on the matter as provided in the report.

05. Keeping proper records of the operations of the printing machines belonging to the council.

It was decided that it was appropriate to use it.

06. The lowest prices are offered when purchasing office stationery and other supplies.

It was decided that it would be appropriate to give priority to the local community.

07. The defects and faults related to the motor grader and the belt loader of the institution

When discussing the previous articles on repairs, these machines

It is expected that a large amount of money will be spent on repairs, and accordingly, the institution's funds will be

The condition of the vehicles is also poor and the cost of repairs has been high in recent years.

This is due to the fact that even if renovation work is carried out, the income generated cannot be matched.

To take further action based on the observations made in the full report on the vehicles.

It was decided that action was appropriate.

08. The tractor bearing UPRB 4995 was presented in the letter for obtaining tire clearance.

The Honorable Speaker asked the House whether there were any problems with the dam.

Hon. L.L. Sujith Kumara, Member of Parliament, again presented the facts and stated that the dam that was built on the road leading to the dam is in a dangerous condition and that it should be demolished as soon as possible and steps should be taken to prevent the dangerous situation. If you can inform us in writing about it, please do so. The Hon. Speaker stated that it would be easier to take further action. Hon. B.B. Sirith Priyadarshana, Member of Parliament, made statements

The road is narrow in some places and the wires are exposed in those places, which could cause accidents, so the relevant authorities should be informed to make arrangements for proper repair. The Hon. Councillor stated that if the matter is reported in writing, necessary action will be taken.

The Honorable Mr. Vakwa .M. Dharmadasa Bandara

Today is a very beautiful day. Moreover, if you had come to this place today, whether from home or abroad, you would have thought that all the people would have been united and that the council would act legally and take very good decisions for the benefit of the people by promoting unity. Therefore, I am very proud. It was mentioned about the respectful behavior of the members and that the council's consent was sought to build a hotel near the Myanuthu Ara tank through the intervention of the private sector. The situation related to that was asked. In that, the honorable member said that the land mentioned belongs to the Irrigation Department and it is appropriate to intervene for the purpose with their consent.

Hon. Mrs. R.M. Inrawathi

In this division, the young graduates of the A.D.S. (S.D.) and the High School Diploma are unemployed. For their advancement, if any employment opportunities can be provided by the entrepreneurs who are doing large-scale work in this division, it is their duty and I request the Hon. Members to intervene in this regard.

The Honorable Mr. W.M. Wasantha Ranjith

The Dhaka Junction is a very crowded and well-known interchange junction. This street, which is between 700-800, is being cleaned daily. However, there are not enough toilets for their sanitation, which is essential. There is a government land of 09 acres nearby, let's get that land and build two toilets with shops there. He said that the land will be cleared first, and the land will be cleaned and other activities related to cleaning and other activities can be done in the morning.

H.M. His Excellency Indika Bandara

In the morning, the buses that run between Athimadal and Dakatiagala Deva Daya bring teachers and children to schools in the area. However, it has been observed that the bus service has not been carried out properly recently. Teachers are not allowed to leave the schools until 9.00 am. In this situation, academic activities are disrupted. Therefore, it was requested that those who are sent to the schools at 6.00 am can reach the scheduled time and that this be informed. The popular school in the area, the Laoya Srioli School, does not have enough teachers. Similarly, the Hatarawa School does not have potable water. Kidney-related problems can arise due to this. The school is located in the middle of the field on a black stone. It is hindering sports activities. The relevant departments should be informed to remove it. Similarly, the library is also dilapidated and needs to be repaired. There are other significant problems. That is, they are trying to acquire land in the Arawa area of Worshawa by calling it Galadabada Remerawa. It is known that this is a scheme carried out by preparing fake deeds. We should look into it. Furthermore, the road leading to the village of Kandurugada is being blocked by the forest department. It is said that it is impossible to travel easily for 35 people.

The land issue is being raised as a problem, but it is also being told that forest cultivation is being carried out on those cultivated lands, but those activities are not being carried out. I once again request that urgent steps be taken to restore the electricity supply in the division. There are 02 helpless villages in the division. They should be given justice. There are also people in the area who do not have toilet facilities. There are also helpless villages who do not have toilets. It is our responsibility to look after them. At the same time, it is very important to develop and utilize the Hethaarawa Dola land. The Mayuragama road is also used by 80 people. The children who go to Garment use the dark road in Dabadahoma. Since there are no lamps, they have to travel in the dark. I respectfully request that you please consider this matter and address it. Therefore, I am tabling all relevant papers.

The Honorable Mr. R.M. Amaravans

Today, making decisions is considered very important. Decisions that are made without prior knowledge of the situation are made in a way that the public can fully agree on.

Even the foreigners who know the country will appreciate this kind of situation. Even though we do not have full experience, we are acting like a kind person. Let us set a good example during this time and continue on our successful journey. This is the most important thing we can do for the people.

Honorable Vice President P.Wakwa Asanka Indunil

In this way, all the people working together reflect the honorable situation. The Hon. Speaker, upon discussing the land being dealt with by the Galabada Borshava at the Council Coordination Committee, informed that it has been decided to temporarily stop its intervention until the issue is resolved through the intervention of the Minister of Lands. We are a team that thinks differently. We are creatively working towards the progress of the people and we are not leaving any stone unturned. The oppressed are being exploited in a very inhumane manner. We are being deprived of privileges and opportunities. It is our responsibility to create a victorious society for everyone in the form of education, child rights, etc. As a constitutional institution, we should act responsibly and generate revenue, not oppress the people, but ensure their rights and privileges. We should act in this way and make this the most exemplary Pradeshiya Sabha. For that, the Honorable Speaker is setting a very good example for us.
