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The monthly meeting of the Siyambalanduwa Pradeshiya Sabha on 28th November 2025 commenced at 9.20 am with the Hon. Chairman W.V. Susantha Pradeep Kumara presiding. At that, the work of the council commenced as per the agenda, welcoming all the members participating in the general meeting today, including the Hon. Vice Chairman. The following was the agenda:

01. Adoption of the report of the previous meeting.

The Hon. Chairman, in accordance with the agenda, first informed the House that the report of the previous month had been read and approved. Accordingly, the proposal moved by Hon. K.M. Ajith Pushpananda was seconded by Hon. G. Shanika Priyadarshani. The House was informed to present any shortcomings or errors in this report, if any, and not to approve it. Since no shortcomings or amendments were presented, the report was unanimously approved. Thereafter, the House was given the opportunity to approve the report of the special general meeting held on 2025.11.13. The proposal made by Hon. Vice Chairman P.K. Asanka Idunil that it be appropriate to approve the report of the special general meeting held on 2025.11.13 was seconded by Hon. D.M. Kamal Gunaratne. No deficiencies or amendments were presented in this report, and the report was also unanimously approved by the House.

Honorable Mr. V. Susantha Pradeep Kumara

Chairman, the debate will be concluded and accordingly, the goods survey team will be conducted in this manner. The agreement of the House was sought for this proposal. The proposal was unanimously passed by the House. Let us proceed accordingly.

02. Proposal to develop three-wheeler parking lots

This proposal was proposed by the Honorable Chairman and seconded by the Honorable K. R. M. Amaravansa. We have discussed the proposal to develop this three-wheeler parking lot before. We will now take steps to remove the disorder in the division and make the road convenient for the people.

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The next step was to seek the approval of the council to allocate funds to prepare nameplates and stickers for all three-wheelers used for hire. The opportunity was given to present any ideas for this.

The Honorable Chairman gave the floor to the House for debate.

Hon. K. M · Mr. Wasantha Ranjith Kumara

This proposal is good. There are three-wheelers, approved or not. All three-wheelers I suggest that it is appropriate to register anew.

The Honorable L. L. Sujith Kumara

Clear regulations are needed for this. Three-wheeler associations have been registered separately. For this, three-wheelers have been divided into two categories: professional and leisure-time. There is no clear idea about the parking of those three-wheelers. It is stated that it is appropriate to have clear regulations in this regard and take action.

Hon. R. M I suggest that Mrs.

Indravati, instead of pressuring the public, install meters on three-wheelers or educate them about the fees and regulate them. Otherwise, there are times when the public will face a lot of inconvenience.

Honorable Vice President P Mr. K. Asanka Idunil

We made a clarification on this in the last session. However, Honorable Speaker, now we have gone to some extent in this matter. Here, if we say that three-wheeler parking lots are currently being identified. Currently, we are doing the matter of identifying three-wheeler users as a profession to some extent. Here, the proposal brought by the Speaker is because there is a need to separate those who are identified in carrying out this process. In this regard, it is especially important to mention that the Siyamba Landuwa Pradeshiya Sabha area is divided into two parts, personal and professional. Therefore, these two have to be managed. Earlier, an Honorable Member of Parliament had expressed his opinion that we cannot collect fees. In this, the money circulates in this way, the money that we collect from the Members of Parliament goes to the Council Fund. In the meantime, there is no possibility of spending that money and putting the remaining money into the council fund. Therefore, all we can do is to put the fee we collect or the tax money we collect for it into the council fund and spend it from there. As the Honorable Member Indrani stated, we will definitely have to go for fee regulation. What she said is true. The fees here are levied by the three-wheeler associations at the national level in Siyambalanduwa. This control has to be vested in the Siyambalanduwa Pradeshiya Sabha because of the reasons mentioned above. Many three-wheeler owners in our area are doing this by causing great suffering to the people. The powers we have also stated that if the public is suffering, we will have to take direct action in this regard. Taking all these factors into account, we will have to intervene as a Pradeshiya Sabha regarding all three-wheelers. If they provide proper services after the establishment, we, the public in the area, will have to take care of those professionals and provide the necessary public facilities for those professionals by intervening as the local council. We will also have to stand up for the dignity of the profession and we will also have to stand up for the three-wheeler parking lot, whether it is their garbage or the lighting there.

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We will have to pay close attention to this. All these matters are taken into account in advance.

We are implementing the program. There is another thing that we do not see in the game itself, the poison you know.

Three-wheelers to prevent the trade of poisonous drugs Drivers can be employed. They have awareness about this. Under the control of the council Let's do this. The safety of women from people riding three-wheelers in the future Arrangements can also be made here. This is a good program. Let's continue this.

Honorable Mr. V. Susantha Pradeep Kumara

Chairman D expressed positive views on this matter. If there are any further suggestions, the opportunity to express their views is open. Yes. Submit your comments.

Hon. W. P. Mr. Saman Warnakulasuriya

It is good to organize three-wheeler parking. There was a misunderstanding when this program was started earlier. There were those who took it. There were those who deviated from this. In some places, irregularities were committed in the development of three-wheeler parks. This needs to be regulated and three-wheeler parking spaces should be allocated using the power of the council. This is a problem in the area. Something to do. Act as a local council. We all work to support each other. Let's do it. Some businesses in some cities have opposed the use of three-wheeler parking. This is something that should be done by bringing together police officers and identifying suitable parking areas. For this purpose Create a systematic program for registering three-wheelers with the approval of the council. This is very good. Suitable Plan accordingly.

We will make the final decision as a council, not according to their opinions, but according to our own.

Accordingly, this proposal was passed by the House with the unanimous consent of all members of the House.

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The Honorable Vice-Chairman P.K. Asanka Idunil adjourned the House for 10 minutes for tea time. Honorable Vice President P. Mr. K. Asanka Idunil _____

Thank you very much, Honorable Chairman, we have discussed this proposal in several previous sessions. We came to a decision. Before the council could make our fair grounds our own, they had been given to the tenants. We have been observing these markets for the past few days. How do we start this again? To find out more about the issues being discussed. Here, the coverage within the market area Proper divisions have been made for the merchants and gentlemen in the areas where they operate. There, the observation The main thing that happened was that the developed parts were not in demand, but rather in favor of the traders. It refers to the area outside of that. Accordingly, there is no proper path based on several factors. Some The vendors are occupying a large space. Some vendors are crowded. Here It is easier for the consumer and the merchant to set boundaries. Or go to the consumer community. It's difficult to come. With those facts, we realized that the boundaries have been defined and the roads are ours. If you separate the sides, the tight fit will be minimized. It is convenient for both the customer and the seller. It is unfair to the trader, the consumer and the local council in collecting taxes. You can pay taxes without paying taxes. One thing we have seen over and over again is that not only in Siyambalanduwa, In other areas, for example in the Buttala area, the market was on the side of the road, but now that has changed. Close to the main road. A certain community of traders trades at the bus stand. They also trade on the roadside. There is a high incidence of road accidents here. All the vendors here on Siyambalanduwa market day If it can be taken to the market, all inconveniences can be avoided. There are restrictions for this. We have to make decisions, and for that we need to use our two technical officers. By defining these boundaries, we will be able to provide services to the consumer and business community and meet our obligations. It is also possible to collect taxes fairly.

The Honorable Chairman allocated time for debate on the proposal and invited comments. The council was informed to present.

Hon. D. Mr. M. Kamal Gunaratne _____

Hon. K. R. M Mr. Amaravansa.

When it comes to demarcation, our goal is to go beyond the current situation. To carry out development. Now we must do it in an orderly and clean manner. In any developed country, there are A market is a concept. The bazaar concept that exists in some countries is very good. It is orderly. It is clean. We Let's gradually change the current situation. Because we even take the food we eat and leave it on a stick on the ground. The types of vegetables and fruits being brought are not smart at all. Collect income tax at the market. After all, the responsibility of the market has come to us as the Pradeshiya Sabha. In determining the boundaries, one A vendor can be given 100 square feet. We need to set the limits as needed. The vendors are trying very hard to get to the entrance to the market. The helpless people are in the market. It's all over the place. It should be done systematically. Even collecting taxes is difficult. Therefore, the market should be arranged so that the consumer can move freely. Otherwise, a papadam vendor There are three in the middle. Another onion is in the middle. Therefore, it is difficult to say in order. We must make a decision. We must identify the vendors as per the by-laws and gazette. The separation should be done. As the Hon. Saman stated, let's identify the vendors properly. New Let's give the opportunity to the traders. Let's start developing it into a smart market. Everyone's Provide support.

Hon. R. M Mrs. Indravati

When selling vegetables and fruits at the market, small covered stalls are set up and tiers are set up to store the vegetables. It would be good if it was arranged in a way that could be cleaned. The Dombagahawela market is currently right across the street and the pharmacy is nearby. It has gone to the same side. On the other side, it has gone to the same side as the Neelaveedda road. On the road There are a lot of obstacles for the people. This makes it difficult to switch to vehicles. Therefore I propose to tidy up the Dombagahawela market as well.

Honorable Vice President Mr. K. Asanka Idunil

When it comes to demarcation, since it was a proposal from my side, I have to agree with that. Please present some specific points regarding this. As the Hon. Member Mahesh said, money The amounts are published in the gazette. We have decided to divide this. Minimum division The area is limited to 50 square feet and the maximum division is 100 square feet. The road system and What we do is create the environment for traders to trade. Public wholesale markets and retail We do markets. Identification, registration, pricing, price collection, regulation, Counseling, follow-up, and subjecting to a system of conditions. But from the system of conditions It is not said that only the business community is subject to the terms and conditions system. Even the consumer The conditions are subject to the system. How do we develop our property as a local council? We will include it in the project report. We will present it to the General Assembly in December. We are contacting government agencies including the police, public health inspectors, etc. Traders are engaging the public in this. By the end of December, we will have this completed. To provide relief to the public, we have demarcated the market area from one land to another.

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The boundaries are to be taken as a basis. For this, the expenses required for painting, such as stones, ropes, etc. will have to be incurred. Some money will be spent. This will be implemented under our supervision with the full involvement of the technical officer. After that, we present the summary of the expenses. Since the four markets are different from each other, the expenses incurred will vary from one to another.

Honorable Chairman W.Mr. V. Susantha Pradeep Kumara

As stated by Hon. Mahesh, the collection of money is done as published in the Gazette. The collection of money at the market is mentioned on page 25 of the House report. Everyone requested us to streamline this proposal. We hope to do it in an orderly and clean manner. Everyone's support is needed for this. Accordingly, since no objections were raised, this is passed by the House with the consent of the House.

The residents of Manabharana area recommended that the issues related to the roads in the Manabharana division be referred to the Maha Sabha.

Siyambalanduwa Pradeshiya Sabha - General Assembly Meeting Report dated 28.11.2025

Honorable Vice President Mr. K. Asanka Idunil.

As a party and in the Pradeshiya Sabha, we express our condolences for those who died in Sri Lanka due to the current bad weather. We will have to face many difficulties in the future. In the future, we will have to work with the staff 24 hours a day. We talked about the message given in the Manabharana area. It is the smallest area in terms of area. We can see less development in terms of roads. The most suitable area to carry out this pilot project is Manabharana. The Chairman talked about dengue control. He constantly monitored and assigned tasks to us and initiated actions. We discussed by bringing together all government institutions. We will have to pay more attention to the Buddhama, Siyambalanduwa, and Athimale areas. All 24 of us come together and directly intervene in the development of these areas. That is our responsibility. I want to thank MP Amaravansa. Regarding his apology and correction of the mistake he made. The General Assembly is a very respectable place. Let us all respect everyone. The Finance and Policy Committee should express its views on the financial powers and the Council has been given financial powers due to misunderstanding and lack of attention. The financial powers have been given to the Committee as per the Act, not as per the previous law. There should be a strong quorum in the Finance Committee like the Council. That is how we are working. As Mahesh said regarding the irregular consumption of water in the Siyambalanduwa market, we have an informal city. There is no place to provide relief to the community and tourists. We have to give the market land for that. Before long, we will get a place for that. We worked with the Chairman by joining hands on the issue of street lamps. A large number of bulbs have been installed over the past period. Due to the economic crisis, we cannot do the renovations as fast as we think. With the decisions we have made, after activating the inactive bulbs, the next step is maintenance. It will not be difficult. We have allocated nearly 5 lakhs for the coming year. The Orange company's distributor is in Buttala. We were able to buy bulbs from Ranjith Electronics for less than that company. We do not look at problems as incidents. We only look at their sustainable solutions. A small section may be unhappy with some decisions. We will have problems regarding the three-wheeler parking lot. We will solve them slowly. As Mahesh said, I inspected the drainage system in front of Sri Pali Maha Vidyalaya. It will happen in the future.

We discussed in the training sessions how we will deal with it as a council. Only a few people participated in it. Therefore, some mistakes occur while making some of our proposals. Decisions should be made in the proposals that have been postponed according to the agenda. We talked about the responsibilities of the Pradeshiya Sabha. The rules and regulations state how we will act. It will be important in the future. We have come to work for the public. What we should do is to convert the Pradeshiya Sabha into a municipal council at the earliest opportunity. We express our sorrow and regret for the disaster that has occurred.

Honorable Chairman Mr. V. Susantha Pradeep Kumara

I will begin my speech that should be made after the discussions held today. Accordingly, the council has to be held. We faced some problematic situations. I am happy that it has been changed. We have been subjected to a major disaster due to the disaster situation. The people of Buttala, Badalkumbura, Medagama, Madulla are saddened. The President has gathered today to take urgent measures for disaster relief. Accordingly, he will inform us to take action very soon. Be informed in our group as well. Make your awareness to the group. We worked together during the Local Government Week. I regret the inconvenience caused to MP Gunaratne in that regard. At that time, our political agenda was not applied there. That program is a national program. From there

There was a noisy situation in the assembly. We would like to work together. We face problems at those times. Member Gunaratne did not do party politics at those times. He regrets the inconvenience caused at those times. We have a national decision on the Kotiyagala land issue. The President has decided to compensate those who will lose their lands. We are working to provide lands to every farmer. That is a national program. We talked about the motor grader. We will intervene in this early next year. We will get a motor grader as soon as possible. We are not asking for it to be done with private money. We will do it anyway. It will take some time. Even in my area, a motor grader was not sent during these disasters. 25 lakhs did not go to the crocodile farm. Farmers' organizations can spend only 20 lakhs. The crocodile farm road has been developed on several occasions. At the request of the people, another narrow road was built. The crocodile farm road is a wide main road. We will prepare it in the future. We requested to provide a lawn mower. As MP Ranjith said, they said that it is not possible to cut the road from a technical point of view. We are sending you letters for the dengue eradication program. This is a program that is being implemented by government officials together. If you can, gather some people who have lawn mowers. We can provide oil for that. We will prepare such situations. We can collect all the things like bottles, plastic on the spot. The government is intervening to provide relief in disaster situations. You and we will support you. May everyone be given the strength and courage to serve the public in the future. I would like to thank everyone who came today.
